Don't blame or punish your kids if they tell you about an uncomfortable online encounter. Your best strategy is to work with them, so you both can learn from what happened and figure out how to keep itfrom happening again.
- [5] Adolescents and young adults have become the largest segment of the world population with internet access. For that reason, the threat posed by drug-related activities occurring on internet is quite serious.
- [6] But the internet has so far served as a very valuable tool to bring mankind closer together and to remove some of the barriers inherent in the "real" world.
